
Data and methods – setting the scene?

- Survey of female farmers
 - Study area: Austria
 - Online survey
 - Agricultural population 115,615 farms
 - Relevant 2,200 questionnaires






Partnership – heaven or hell?

- 92% of the respondents live in a partnership.
- The relationship with the partner is evaluated as good.



Female famers 2016, age***




*** highly significant (p≤0.001).

Parental duties – how much, by whom?

- A female farmer has 2.6 children on average.
- The bringing up of children is evaluated as good.
- The main care work is done by the female farmer and her partner.



Female famers 2016, age***





Cohabitation - heaven or hell?

- 50% of the respondents live together with one or both of the predecessors on the farm.
- With increasing age, living on the farm with parents or in-laws is felt less and less pleasant.

Caregiving – how much, by whom?

- On 16% of the farms there are relatives who need to be cared for.
- Female farmers do the most of the caring for elderly people in need.
- With age female farmers do more caregiving and the work done by third persons is decreasing
